

EU-Sanctions against Russia

Dear Sir or Madam,

On 23 June 2023, the EU Member States adopted the 11th sanctions package against Russia with EU Regulation 2023/1214. This Regulation further specifies the requirements for the steel production and processing chain.

Example:

Article 3g is amended as follows:

(a) Paragraph 1 point (d) shall be replaced by the following:

“(d) to import or purchase, directly or indirectly, as of 30 September 2023, iron and steel products listed in Annex XVII when they have been processed in a third country using iron and steel products listed in Annex XVII originating in Russia; for products listed in Annex XVII that have been processed in a third country using steel products of CN codes 7207 1 1 or 7207 12 10 or 7224 90 originating in Russia, this prohibition shall apply as of 1 April 2024 for CN code 7207 1 1 and as of 1 October 2024 for CN codes 7207 12 10 and 7224 90; L 159 1/10 EN Official Journal of the European Union 23.6.2023 for the purposes of applying this point, importers must provide, at the time of importation, evidence of the country of origin of the iron and steel semi-finished products used for processing the product in a third country;”

Naturally, we are also monitoring the further development of the EU sanctions and the additional EU sanctions packages.
